BILL SUMMARIES

HB 1019 (second vote) houses the budget for Adult Farm Management. Passed and signed by the Governor. NDFU supported.

HB 1020 (second vote) houses the NDSU Extension, Northern Crops Institute (NCI), and Upper Great Plains Transportation Institute (UGPTI) budgets. Passed and signed by the Governor. NDFU supported.

HB 1066 revises the oil and gas gross production tax distribution formula to address municipal, county, and township infrastructure needs. Passed and signed by the Governor. NDFU supported.

HB 1349 amends the hemp laws to align with the 2018 Farm Bill. Passed and signed by the Governor. NDFU supported.

HB 1388 adds “second cousin” to the list of kin that can form a corporation or limited liability corporation for farming and ranching. Passed and signed by the Governor. NDFU opposed.

SB 2012 (second vote) is the budget for the Department of Human Services. The bill extends the Medicaid expansion program through July 31, 2021. Passed and signed by the Governor. NDFU supported.

SB 2033 (first vote) would have provided drafting services for an initiated measure sponsoring committee. Defeated. NDFU monitored.

SB 2297 (second vote) appropriates \$20 million for the Ag Products Development Center at NDSU and allows the Northern Crops Institute to begin fundraising. Passed and signed by the Governor. NDFU supported.

SB 2315 (second vote) would have amended the posting and hunting on private land laws. Defeated. NDFU supported.

SB 2344 (second vote) allows for the use of pore space for oil and gas recovery and disposal operations. Deems that the migration of substances into pore space is not a trespass, nuisance, or other tort. Passed and signed by the Governor. NDFU opposed.

SB 2345 (second vote) restricts counties and townships from establishing setbacks that exceed state law and establishes ordinance review procedures through the Agriculture Commissioner’s office. Passed and signed by the Governor. NDFU opposed.

SB 2360 changes the farm residence property tax exemption from “net” to “gross” and removes the dollar limitation for allowable non-farm income. Passed and signed by the Governor. NDFU supported.
